A survivor of traumatic brain injury at age 18 and spinal cord injury at 41, Bob loved riding and immediately formed a special bond with his therapy horse Beauty. They were inseparable until Bob's death in November 2014. Bob's family chose to honor his memory by supporting this organization that he loved.

Through May 2015, Bob's family and friends donated over \$3,750 to Bob's Fund, established by CoBI (Council on Brain Injury), in support of our "Hope Springs for All" program. Unmounted Equestrian Therapy Pilot Program (UP!)

From June 2014 through March 2015, Hope Springs delivered equine services to several ReMed clients with traumatic brain injury (TBI) through our Unmounted Equestrian Therapy Pilot Program (UP!).

The program combined horse care education and unmounted horse handling with equestrian-themed music, cognitive and art therapy. Our instructors worked closely with RedMed to identify the pilot's vision and goals. The pilot focused on delivering benefits including improvements in core strength, handeye coordination, and dexterity as well as increased self-esteem, confidence and independence.

Funding for the pilot program totaled over \$5,000 and was supported by grants from the Council on Brain Injury (CoBI) and The Pilot Club of Valley Forge. We are very grateful to these organizations for their continued support of HSET!



My son Raven, born with Optic Nerve Hypoplasia, has been in occupational, physical, vision and speech therapies since he was a year old. We came to Hope Springs in 2013 because I had heard that equestrian therapy often does wonders for people. I wanted Raven to have an activity that would really be fun AND beneficial for him. Well, we have found it.

At first, Raven resisted going to lessons, although he enjoyed himself once he got there. Today, he is certainly always ready to ride his therapy horse Beauty; he talks about her at home a lot too. Raven LOVES to ride! He has always needed a little extra input; his horse's movement definitely gives him that stimulation. And Raven has fun imitating the snorts that Beauty makes.

I have seen many improvements over the two years since Raven started riding. He gets good speech practice using commands during lessons and great exercise reaching across his midline, especially with his weaker arm. All around, Raven has grown much stronger, and his focus and visual attention have gotten much better. While he still has a weaker leg that can cause him to trip, Raven is 100% better now at regaining his balance.

All of the instructors and volunteers at Hope Springs are amazing. Everyone was welcoming and helpful right from the start. We are so thankful to Hope Springs for all that they have done for Raven -- including all of the donors who make therapeutic riding possible for kids like Raven. We wouldn't be able to continue Raven's lessons without this kind of support. Thank you!"
